Alexander Pope (21 May 1688 – 30 May 1744) was an eighteenth-century English poet. He is best known for his satirical and discursive poetry—to include *The Rape of the Lock*, *The Dunciad*, and *An Essay on Criticism*—as well as for his translation of Homer. He is the second most frequently quoted writer in *The Oxford Dictionary of Quotations* after Shakespeare.
