SHORT ANSWER STUDY GUIDE QUESTIONS - Pygmalion

Act One

1. What purpose does the rain shower serve?
It brings together different social classes under the shelter from the storm. Characters, Eliza and Higgins would never have met.
2. The note taker is assumed to be of what profession? What actually is his profession?
He is assumed to be a detective because he is taking notes. He is actually a professor of languages.
3. What does the note taker say about a "woman who utters such depressing and disgusting sounds"? She has no right to be anywhere, not even a right to live.
4. The note taker brags about what he could do for the flower girl within three months. What does he claim? He could pass her off as a duchess at the Embassy Ball.
5. Who takes the cab freely tonight? Why? Eliza does. Higgins has given her money, and she feels rich.
6. What do Higgins and Pickering have in common? They are both socially interested in languages.

Act Two

1. When Higgins recognizes the flower girl, what is his reaction? Go away—he's already recorded enough of her particular dialect.
2. What does Eliza overhear next? She wants to speak English well enough to work in a flower shop.
3. Even after he agrees to teach her, what is Higgins' attitude towards Eliza? He is a bully with no respect for her or her feelings.
4. Describe Mrs. Pearce's role. Mrs. Pearce serves as a mother figure for Eliza. She also tries (unsuccessfully) to serve as Higgins' conscience, trying to make him recognize that changing someone's life carries responsibility.
5. Eliza determines to leave rather than to be further insulted. How does Higgins persuade her to stay? Cheats.
6. What is the point of the bath scene? Poor people didn't necessarily have access to "toilettes" like baths. She has never seen herself without clothes.
7. Mrs. Pearce makes some suggestions to Higgins. What are they? He should quit swearing in particular. He should quit saying "simply." He also needs to be dressed when he comes to breakfast and not have things lying about.
